

## Regular Verbs in the Future Tense

To put a regular verb in the future tense (positive), add -idh to the imperative form whose last vowel is an i or e. For imperative forms whose last vowel is a, o, or u, add -aidh. The “negative”, “positive question”, and “negative question” forms are the dependent forms and leave off the ending.

Remember, “cha” and “chan” lenite. “Chan” is used before vowels or ‘f’ verbs when lenition results in a vowel sound. “An” becomes “Am” if the first letter of the verb is m, b, f, or p.

Following the patterns given by the examples, fill out the rest of the chart.
